Welcome back to the second half of the Autumn term. With the change of the clocks it is certainly noticeable that Winter has arrived as the weather has become much colder. Please ensure that your child has a coat in school every day and that their name is clearly written inside. All children are told to wear their coats at break and lunchtime and will be sent inside to get them if they do not take them out, however, children often take their coats off and unless it is named it is very difficult for us to return the coat. School finishes at 3:15pm and your child must be collected by a responsible person age 16 or over. Head Boy, Head Girl and Prefects



Illness
