Dear Parents/Carers

Happy New Year and welcome back to the Spring Term! It was lovely to welcome the pupils back into school last week. The pupils have settled quickly and hard work has begun. As always we are exceptionally proud of our pupils and the way they have returned to school and settled straight into the working routine is admirable.

Half Term Homework

Uniform

On a similar note, we do not allow sandals in the Summer Term for safety reasons, so please remember this when buying shoes for your child later in the year. Girls wearing headscarves should not use a sharp pin to keep them closed, but instead use the safety pin style pins.

PE kit must be in school every day. Children still do PE outside in the Spring Term so please send a plain, dark tracksuit into school. Trainers or pumps must also form part of the PE kit. For PE, headscarves should either be removed, or girls should wear a sports headscarf like the one pictured below.

Attendance

Our attendance as a whole school was 97.05% for the Autumn term. This is the highest we have ever achieved and is higher than other schools in the local community. Thank you for joining us in recognising the importance of your child being in school every day; it is wonderful to feel so much support in this crucial area. As a reminder, to achieve this figure we have asked parents to organise dental and doctor appointments outside of school hours. The majority of parents have willingly done this and we will continue to refuse to authorise non-urgent appointments to ensure the children receive the best possible education. No holidays in term-time will be authorised.
